While hearing a plea on jails and prisoners, a bench of Justices BR Gavai and Sandeep Mehta said it wants to expand the presence of open prisons across the country.

"One of the solutions for overcrowding of the prisons



can be stablishing open air prisons/camps. The said sys-tem is efficiently working in the state of Rajasthan. Apart from addressing the issue of congestion in prison, it also addresses the issue of rehabil-itation of prisoners," the bench said. The bench made clear that it would not touch upon issues related to jalls and prison

reforms which are already pending adjudication before its coordinate benches in some

its coordinate benches in some other petitions. The counsel appearing for the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) told the court it had sought responses from all states on open prisons and 24 of them have responded.

THE right to campaign in an election is neither a fundaelection is neither a funda-mental nor a constitutional right, the Enforcement Directorate told the Supreme Courton Thursday, adayahead of the scheduled pronounce-ment of the court's order on grant of interim bail to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in a money luundering case. In a fresh affidavit filed in the

top court to thwart the release of the embattled Aam Aadmi of the embattled Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convenor, the central probe agency said there were numerous exam-ples where politicians con-tested elections while in judi-cial custody, and some even won, but were never granted interim bail for campaigning. "No political leader has been granted interim bail for cam-

paigningeven though he is not the contesting candidate. Even a contesting candidate is not granted interim bail if he is in custody for his own cam-naigning

paigning.

THE toll in a blaze at a fireworks manufacturing unit in Sivakasi on Thursday rose to eight, with one more worker succumbing

one more worker succumbing to his burns, police said.

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MKStalin, who expressed condolences over the incident, directed the district authorities to provide appropriate medical care to the injured and save lives.

Eight workers, including five women and three men, were killed in the accident at a fireworks-manufacturing unit near Sengamalapatti in Sivakasi in the district.

Seven rooms where the firecrackers were stocked were completely gutted, police said, Police and fire service personnel rushed the injured to the Government hospital in Sivakasi.

A senior police official said the cause of the fire was being

ascertained and added that the unit is a licenced one. Expressing grief over the death of the five women and death of the five women and three men in the explosion, Chief Minister Stalin said that immediately after receiving information about the acci-dent, he directed the district collector to promptly launch a rescue operation. It was learnt that more than 10 persons were injured and they required med-ical attention, he said. "I have directed the official sto ensure appropriate life-saving treat-ment for the injured," Stalin said in a release here.

AIR India Express cabin crew on Thursday decided to withdraw their strike and the airline agreed to reinstate 25 staff who were terminated from service, according to sources. A section of the cabin crew started reporting sick from Tuesday night to protest against the alleged mismanagement at the airline, forcing cancellation of more than 170 flights and impacting thousands of passengers at various airports.

The decisions to end the strike and withdraw the termination letters were agreed upon during a conciliation

The decisions to the time state and without the mination letters were agreed upon during a conciliation meeting between the representatives of cabin crew and the airline management at the Office of the Chief Labour Commissioner (Central) in the national capital on

Thursday. The meeting, which went on for nearly five hours, was between representatives of Air India Express Employees Union (AIXEU) and airline management. The hours, was between representatives of Air India Express Employees Union (AIXEU) and airline management. The union is affiliated to the Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh (BMS), an associate of the RSS. After the meeting, Girish Chandra Arya, All India Secretary of the BMS, said the termina-tion of 25 cabin crew of Air India Express has been with-drawn. Both parties will discuss the issues and there will be a meeting again on May 28, he said. INDIA'S exports have increased to as many as 115 countries out of the total 239 destinations during 2023-24 despite the global economic uncertainties, according to Commerce Ministry's data. These 115 export destinations, which account for 46.5 per cent

of India's export basket, include the US, UAE, Netherland, China, UK, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Bangladesh, Germany and Italy. The country's merchandise exports dipped by 3 per cent to USD 437.1 billion in the last fiscal However, servlast fiscal. However, serv-ices exports rose to USD 341.1 bn in 2023-24 as against \$325.3 bn.
