RPSC cancels '23 revenue officer exams over paper leak allegations

First exam to be cancelled since the senior teachers' recruitment test in 2022

THE RAJASTHAN Public Service Commission has cancelled its 2023 Revenue Officer Grade II and Executive Officer Class IV examination following allegations of paper leak.

In a statement issued on Friday, the commission said the question papers of both exams conducted on May 14, 2023, were leaked. A re-examination will be held on March 23, 2025, the com-

mission said. This is the first exam that has been cancelled since the senior teachers' recruitment test in 2022. The development comes two days after 28 people, including 11 government employees, were arrested in connection with the alleged leak following statewide raids. "On the date of conducting the exam May 14, 2023, multiple FIRs related to cheating were registered in Bikaner. After three primary reports were filed regarding cheating of many candidates using Bluetooth and their in-

vestigation, the crime was found to be proven that the integrity and confidentiality of the Revenue Officer Grade-II and Executive Officer Class-IV Examination, 2022 (Exam Date 14 May 2023) has been violated. That is why the Commission has decided to cancel the exams and re-examination will be done," said RPSC secretary Raminvas Mehta. Some 1,96,483 candidates had appeared in the Executive Officer Class IV and Revenue Officer Grade-II examination conducted for 11 posts on May 14, 2023. A to-

tal of 311 candidates were short-listed for eligibility check and document verification. Suspicions grew after candidates allegedly showed a basic lack of knowledge of the subjects involved during document verification in August, leading the RPSC to write to the SOG. On October 19, the SOG conducted raids in a total of seven districts -- Nagaur, Jodhpur, Churu, Hanumangarh, Sikar, Jaipur, and Bikaner. Of the 28 arrested, 17 were produced before a local court, which remanded them in police custody.

Violence erupts over bursting crackers in Bhilwara district

ONE PERSON suffered minor injuries after a clash broke out between members of two communities allegedly over bursting firecrackers in Bhilwara district, police said on Friday.

They said some men were bursting firecrackers at Mangla Chowk when another group objected to it.

"The altercation turned into a stabbing incident in which one Devendra Singh suffered minor injuries," a police official said.

Following the stabbing incident, members of both communities pelted each other with stones. A car was also set ablaze.

Superintendent of Police Dharendra Singh said additional force was deployed in the area and the situation was brought under control.

Over 25 people have been detained in connection with the incident, he added.

Govt committed to addressing farmers' plight: CM Sharma

CHIEF MINISTER Bhajan Lal Sharma on Friday said that his government is committed to addressing the challenges faced by farmers.

Addressing a public meeting in Khinvasar in support of the party candidate Revant Ram Danga, Sharma accused the previous Congress government of turning their backs on farmers by promising to revoke the Yamuna Water Agreement in their Haryana Assembly election manifesto.

Sharma highlighted the work done by the Rajasthan government for the welfare of the farmers, including an increase in the minimum support price (MSP) for wheat through the Kisan Samman Nidhi scheme, Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project and the Yamuna Water Agreement.

He said that the state will procure moong at MSP.

During the address, he said that the paper leak cases that happened during the last government shattered the dreams of the youth.

"We will not spare the criminals who brought tears to the eyes of the youth. So far, the government has sent more than 200 accused behind bars in these

cases. None of them will be spared," he said.

He said that time bound recruitment will be held in the state and four lakh jobs will be given to youths in four years.

The chief minister appealed to the public to vote for the BJP candidate in the upcoming by-polls.

57 candidates file their nomination papers on last day

FIFTY-SEVEN candidates filed their nomination papers on Friday for the seven assembly constituencies of Rajasthan that are going to bypolls on November 13. Results will be declared on November 23.

On the last date of nomination filing, BJP candidates Shanta Devi (Salumbar), Karilal Nanoma (Chorasai) and Revant Ram (Khinvasar) and the Congress' Amit Ola (Jhunjhunu), Deendayal Bairwa (Dausa), Kastoor Chand Meena (Deoli-Uniara), Reshma Meena (Salumbar) and Mahesh Roat (Chorasai) filed their nomination papers.

A total of 94 candidates have filed their nomination papers for the bypolls.

Scrutiny of the papers will be held on October 28 and the last date for withdrawal of candidature is October 30.

People suffering due to BJP gov't's misrule: Gehlot

FORMER RAJASTHAN chief minister Ashok Gehlot on Friday attacked the state's BJP government, saying people were suffering due to its "misrule".

"It has been almost 11 months since the new government was formed. Look at the condition of the state at present. I once mistakenly said that this was not a sarkar but a circus, and monsters started attacking me. But I did not say it with any malice, it is the truth," the senior Congress leader said.

"Ministers are fighting with each other, threatening each other... this is not good governance," he said while addressing a rally in Dausa in support of the Congress candidate from the Dausa Assembly constituency

Deen Dayal Bairwa. "Go to any village in Rajasthan... you will see people saying this," Gehlot added.

He said the previous Congress government had introduced many schemes for the poor and marginalised sections and alleged that the BJP was working to discontinue the schemes.

Gehlot appealed to people to vote for the Congress in the by-polls.

"The Congress alone can work for the good of the country. The way the NDA government is working, they have taken hold of all institutions such as ED, CBI and the Income Tax department. The judiciary is under pressure and such conditions are not good for the country," he said.

Rajasthan Congress chief chief Govind Dotasra also addressed the rally.

Dausa: Man falls into borewell, dies

Jaipur: A man died after falling into a borewell in Dausa district on Friday, police said.

Hemraj Gurjar (44) was trying to remove a motor stuck in the borewell in his agricultural field when the soil collapsed and he fell inside, DSP Dilip Meena said. With the help of a JCB machine, local villagers and police, Hemraj was taken out from the 15-feet-deep borewell in an unconscious state and rushed to the district hospital where doctors declared him dead, he said.

As Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu talk of more children, a look at Sangh Parivar's view on it

THE CONVERSATION on ageing population, demographic change, and political representation of South India is again front and centre. Last week, expressing concern over the ageing population in his state, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu said that his government was contemplating a legislation to incentivise families to have more children.

Days later, Tamil Nadu CM M K Stalin, referring to a potential reduction of South India's share in parliamentary seats after delimitation, remarked, "Why not aim for 16 children?"

While the two CMs currently sit on opposite sides of the political divide at the Centre, they appear united in their concern.

They also seem to echo what has been heard from the Sangh Parivar multiple times over the years — albeit for different reasons.

There are three strands to the Sangh's stance on population. Its senior leaders have spoken of "population imbalance" and openly batted for Hindus having more children in order to balance a "rising population of Muslims". The Sangh has also agreed with southern states over rising "regional imbalance" vis-a-vis population growth. At the same time, population control also remains

on top of the Sangh's agenda.

'More Hindu children'
Speaking at an event in 2005, former RSS chief K S Sudarshan had said: "Do not get into the trap of two-child or one-child norm. If you go by the one-child norm, in the next 120 years, there won't be any successors in your family. You should not have less than three children and if you have more, the merrier it is."

In 2013, at an event in Kochi, RSS general secretary Dattatreya Hosabale, said "bigger Hindu families would prevent minorities" from gaining the upper hand in population in certain parts of the country. He added that elite Hindus should "seriously review family planning".

In 2015, VHP leader Champat Rai said at a press conference that family planning "was no more a personal matter for Hindus". He went on to suggest that "if they continued to remain content" with a single child, "Muslims would take over the country".

The regional concern
In its July issue this year, RSS-linked weekly Organiser echoed the concern of southern states on delimitation and political representation. Opposition parties, particularly those who do well in the South, feel a delimitation exercise based on population could skew elections in favour of parties in the

more populous North as it would give the North more parliamentary seats.

"Regional imbalance is another critical dimension that will impact the delimitation process of the parliamentary constituencies in the future. The states from the West and South are doing relatively better regarding population control measures and, therefore, fear losing a few seats in Parliament if the base population is changed after the census," Organiser's editor Prafulla Kerkar wrote in an editorial.

Kerkar argued that the country needed a policy to ensure that population growth does not disproportionately impact any religious community or region, which, he says, "can lead to socio-economic disparities and political conflicts".

Demography: Dividend versus imbalance

In his 2022 Vijaydashmi speech, RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat raised the issue of "population imbalance" and asked for a comprehensive population control policy that applied to all without exception. "...When there is population imbalance, new countries are created," he said.

The RSS chief also underlined that India's large young population could be leveraged but cautioned that the country needed to

plan for the nation when this population ages in the next 50 years.

In the interim Budget speech in February this year, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman even announced plans to set up a high-powered committee to consider the challenges arising from fast population growth and demographic changes. The committee has not yet been formed.

The numbers

While the 2011 Census does record a higher birth rate among Muslims compared to Hindus, the birth rates of the two communities are said to be progressively converging. The decline in the decadal growth rate of Muslims between 1991 and 2011 has been recorded to be higher than Hindus.

According to the latest National Family Health Survey (NFHS) data, the fertility rate in India stands at 1.99. The fertility rate for Hindus stands at 1.94. Among SCs, it is 2.08 and among STs it is 2.09. For OBCs, the fertility rate is 2.02, almost comparable to the national rate, while for non-SC/ST, non-OBC castes it stands at 1.78. Among Muslims, the fertility rate has been calculated to be at 2.36.

Many in the RSS have even argued for a legislation that could keep Dalits and tribals out of the purview of a population control law.

V-P flags 'structured use of charity to influence'

WARNING AGAINST "structured use of charity to influence the faith of the beneficiary", Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar said that it has serious consequences in a democracy and stressed that assistance to the needy, marginalised, and vulnerable should be without "expectations or claims".

Addressing students at Adichunchanagiri University in B G Nagar in Karnataka's Mandya, he said, "Our civilizational ethos tells us never speak of charity. Charity is never to be claimed. You do it, and you forget about it."

"When you influence the faith of the needy, the marginalised, the vulnerable, things become really very critical," he said.

Emphasising that India as a nation can offer guidance to everyone and anyone about inclusivity, Dhankhar said, "Surely, we don't need lessons in something we have lived through for more than 5,000 years. This philosophy alone is sustainable and makes for global peace and harmony, but some people have a different concept of inclusivity that is destructive of a sense of inclusivity. We have to be extremely cautious and careful."

Dhankhar also urged the youths to "get out of the silos" that government service is the only way out, and look around as India rises on sea, land, in the sky and in space. Cautioning youths against "elements in the country who engage extensively in dissemination of misinformation, disinformation", he said, "this dissemination is very injurious to national health."
