

AUTUMN SETS IN | Rains disappear in state, bringing warmth & comfort

Warm, humid conditions prevail in Bhopal, other cities

Dip in temperature in late evening, night

BHOPAL

Amid the southwest monsoon's withdrawal from Madhya Pradesh, warm and humid conditions prevailed during the daytime in Bhopal and other cities. The mercury level is above the season's normal, and these weather conditions are likely to persist for the next week or so. Temperatures will continue to rise in parts of the state.

The festivities of 'Navratri' are likely to experience these conditions for the remaining days. A gradual change is expected thereafter, leading to typical autumn, pleasant weather. The key highlights of

the current weather include above-average maximum temperatures, a dip in mercury during the late evening and night, and hazy mornings and bright and sunny days.

Bhopal recorded day temperature of 34 degree Celsius which was 0.9 degrees Celsius above normal while it recorded 21.6 degrees Celsius at night. Indore recorded 32.6 degrees Celsius while the minimum temperature stood at 21.6 degrees Celsius.

In the wake of withdrawal of monsoon, such conditions are very evident and remain prevalent, according to meteorological department officials. The last week of October is synonymous with the pleas-



ant feel of wintry flavor. There is no significant weather system around the city and extended neighbourhood. A feeble and dry circulation is

marked in the lower levels.

SHAHUPURA ATM BOOTH HACKING

2 caught on camera, installed schemer in machine

The Chunabhatti police probing the incident in which an ATM booth located in Manisha Market of Shahpura was allegedly hacked and two persons were duped of Rs 2.2 lakh, obtained another lead on Sunday. The police said two men who had been installing a device to clone the ATM card inserted into the machine have been caught on the CCTV camera.

In the CCTV camera footages, one unidentified person is seen installing schemer in the machine while the other man is guarding ATM booth to alert the man present inside. According to Chunabhatti police station TI Bhupinder Kaul Siddhu, the device, which was installed in ATM machine is called schemer. With the help

of schemer, the crooks clone the cards of people who insert their ATM card into the machine and thus gain access to their bank accounts to siphon off money from there.

She said police were currently tracing IP address of schemer with the help of which they would trace the whereabouts of accused and nab them.

Chhatarpur police bust inter-state theft gang, arrest three accused

Stolen booty worth Rs 6 lakh seized

The Chhatarpur police on Sunday busted an interstate theft gang, arresting three individuals involved in a series of burglaries in Garhi Malhara area. The accused Dheeraj Ahirwar, Ramkishan Shrivastava, and buyer Shatrughan alias



Anoop Soni, were found with 6 tolas of gold, 1 kg of silver, Rs 30,000 in cash and two mobile phones amounting to over ₹6 lakh in recovered property.

The theft took place on September 20 when four houses in ward 1 of Garhi Malhara were

burgled. Police gathered evidence and arrested the suspects near Chhatarpur bus stand. The investigation revealed that Soni, a known gangster, had prior offences registered in Mahoba under Gangster Act. Further investigations are underway to track down additional accomplices and recover the remaining stolen items. Inspector Dharmendra Kumar Singh and his team played key roles in the operation.

Congress forms committees for Vijaypur and Budhni bypolls

Congress has constituted two committees for the by-elections scheduled for Vijaypur and Budhni constituencies, said party leaders here on Sunday.

The Bidhni Assembly seat became vacant after former chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan fought Parliament election and was made Union

agriculture minister, while the election in Vijaypur Assembly seat has been necessitated after Congress MLA Ram Niwas Rawat crossed over to BJP and became minister. The charge of Budhni assembly seat has been given to the former union minister Arun Yadav along with the former MLAs Sajjan Singh Verma and Shailendra Patel.

Arun Yadav had contested

the assembly election in 2018, against Shivraj Singh Chouhan and managed to garner around 31% votes and Chouhan had secured more than 60% of votes.

The responsibility of Vijaypur constituency has been given to Rajya Sabha member Ashok Singh. The other members of the committee are MLA Jaivardhan Singh, ex-MLA Lakshman Singh Yadav and Neetu Sikarwar.

Guest teachers encounter issues accessing their details on portal

The teachers, whose data has not been updated in the portal, have been working for free for the entire academic year without receiving any payment.

In Bhind district, one such case has come to light. Guest teacher Parshuram Gurjar, who was appointed in July 2023, has been facing severe difficulties because his details have not been updated to the portal. He is frequently visiting the Directorate of Public Instruction (DPI) in an attempt to resolve the issue, however, despite his efforts, no solution has been provided.

He alleged that the school principal demanded a bribe of Rs 25,000 to process the necessary paperwork and ensure his portal feeding was completed. He was the sole person managing a school with zero permanent teaching staff, conducting all classes for the entire academic session. Yet, despite his dedication, he has not been compensated even a single rupee for his work, he stated.
