Under the Smart City Project, about 306 cameras have been installed on various crossings and roads of Ujjain city, in which overspeed detect cameras have been installed at 12 places and RLVD cameras at 16 places. Till now, through ITMS, action could be taken only against vehicles of the state. Now ITMS has been connected to NIC, so that challans can be made for vehicles outside the state as well.

Traffic DSPs Vikram Singh Kanpuria and Dilip Singh Parihar along with the traffic

police team will inform the drivers violating traffic rules at the crossings daily through SMS and calls and the notice will also be served at their homes. Vehicle owners will be able to pay the fine through UMC Seva App. Vehicle and licence-related action of those vehicle owners who will not pay the fine will remain blocked.

Challans will be issued daily against those not wearing helmets or seat belts, overspeeding and red light violations. Through this action, efforts will be made to improve the traffic system of the city and reduce accidents.

INTERNATIONAL CHEETAH DAY TODAY | Struggles remain Wildest challenge: Seeing them thrive in jungles

After suffering hiccups in its initial phase, the Cheetah Project remains on track despite big challenges.

For instance, the adaptability of cheetahs in wild is still a big challenge. During two years of the project, a few cheetahs were released into the wild. Some of them died while remaining were brought back inside the enclosures for safety reasons. Since their arrival to Kuno, cheetahs have remained inside the enclosures for most of the period, having very little experience of the wild conditions of jungles, terrains and landscape.

"When Cheetah Project was envisaged, criteria of success were chalked out. First



criteria said that out of 20 cheetahs brought to Kuno, at least 50% will survive. Against 50% survival perception, 60% cheetahs (12 adult cheetahs) are surviving. Henceforth, first criteria was successful," retired Principal Chief Conservator of Forest, wildlife, Jasbeer Singh said.

The second criteria focused on breeding, which also suc-

ceeded. Kuno has 12 cheetah cubs, at present. The third criteria centered on releasing cheetahs in jungles. "I feel that if the prey base of Kuno is increased, then cheetahs will survive in the wild," Singh said.

Wildlife activist Ajay Dubey said keeping cheetahs in enclosures for long affected the project. "Risk should be taken

and cheetahs should be released into the wild, instead of doing cheetah farming," he added.

After extinction, cheetahs were brought back to India in a first ever intercontinental translocation of a large carnivore in September 2022. The first batch of eight cheetahs was transported by air from Namibia and was released in Kuno National Park. Currently, Kuno has 24 cheetahs including 12 cubs.

The trial
As cheetah territory is being expanded, making people aware remains a big challenge. When a cheetah strayed to Karauli in Rajasthan in 2023, large number of people came to see it, making rescue operation most challenging.

Three held with suspected wildlife meat

A joint team of Kishanganj police and forest department intercepted an SUV on Agra-Bombay national highway and seized a large quantity of suspected wildlife meat from it on Tuesday morning.

Mhow forest SDO Kailash Joshi said, "Information about the SUV carrying wildlife meat

was already with the police and forest department. When information was received that the car (coming from Bhopal on way to Mumbai) had crossed the toll booth of Pig-damber village, police and forest teams reached Hotel Manal crossing and stopped the vehicle at around 4 am. Two large ice boxes were in the SUV, which had several packets of meat suspected to

be of some wild animals. Car along with the meat was seized and the trio was taken into custody who were identified as Johar (69) of Millat Nagar, Mumbai, Salman (42) of Greater Mumbai and Imtiyaz (39) of Andheri West, Mumbai. The meat sample has been sent to Forensic Science laboratories of Jabalpur and Hyderabad for detection about its type."

Action against noise pollution
